The Worship Committee presented a check for \$1733 to the GNCH Refugee Fund. These monies will enable a continuation of welcoming new arrivals from Afghanistan and more recently from El Salvador. The GNCH housing volunteers have completely furnished 26 apartments. Other volunteers (from 10 Capitol Hill congregations as well as unaffiliated friends) provide English language coaching, employment mentoring, child care and friendship to many of these families. St. Mark's provides a room for the monthly board meeting of GNCH and for regular training sessions for volunteers. We welcome more volunteers and can always find a suitable match for your skills. During this season of Ramadan (May 5 – June 6), our Afghan friends are observing a discipline of fasting from sunrise to sundown and praying for a more faithful life of service. In solidarity with these families, might we recall our own Lenten practice of denial for heightening our spiritual consciousness and commitment to serve our neighbors in the Kingdom of God.
