### From the Vestry and Parish Leadership

**1. Message From the Rector: Watch Out for Phishing Emails.** Please watch out for scam emails that look like they're coming from me. Scammers have been pulling parishioner email addresses from our website or announcements. They send emails from fake g-mail accounts using variants of my name. Memo lines which read something like "God Bless U" or "I Need Your Help." Usually, they send a series of emails asking you to buy a gift card in \$100 denominations and supposedly I will pay you back. If you send them a photo of a gift card number, your money has been stolen.

If you get an email like this, please notify me and I will tell you how to report it to get the account shut down. I may contact you about pledging, I may ask you to fund projects, **yet I will never ask you to send me a photo of a gift card.** You can call me if you are ever in doubt, at the office or on my cell number from the directory. One of our members lost over \$2000 to this and I am furious that they got taken advantage of and that the perpetrator used St. Marks and my name to do it. The problem will likely continue so please be aware; for more info, search for an FBI article entitled "Cyber-Enabled Financial Fraud on the Rise Globally." I am so sorry that this happened and please let me know if it happens to you. - Michele

Small Plots Feed Big Families.** The UN estimates that, due to recent changes in climate and extreme weather patterns, farmers in much of Central America are losing more than half their bean and corn crops. In November, **Roy Lara, Honduran Coordinator of Sustainable Villages Honduras (SVH), will be in DC** to talk about how the program is growing and is more vital than ever. The two SVH staffers, Roy and Idania Reyes, use community development tools to organize alliances of farmers, town councils, water boards, and women and youth groups to protect the Zapotal watershed.
